Australians were crying out for a federal government change, Labor candidate for Ryan, Ross Daniels, said at his successful campaign launch last night.

“The Howard Government has run out of ideas, and we need fresh leadership,” he said.

“I am touched by the support which the people of Ryan are showing me, and if I am elected I will be a hardworking and accessible local member,” he said.

Ross Daniels is a lecturer at the Queensland University of Technology, a long term human rights activist, and a keen Broncos fan. He and his wife live in The Gap with their four children.
